# Capitol Hill Telephone Call Talking Points Advocating for Medicaid support and funding Emphasizing the Value of Medicaid's programs and services

### When Calling the Office:

#### Receptionist or person answering the phone:

The federal government has general rules that all state Medicaid programs must follow, but each state runs its own program. Medicaid plays a vital role in providing long-term care services for older people, including nursing home care and home and community-based services. More than 17 million Americans age 50 and older rely on Medicaid as a critical safety net to stay in their homes, manage chronic conditions, and afford long-term care. The proposed cuts in health coverage, food, and other programs in the bill will worsen health outcomes and increase isolation and the cost of care for older people.
